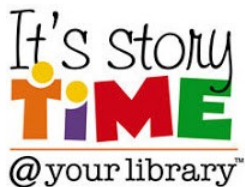

## Try our digital resources and take the library with you wherever you go!

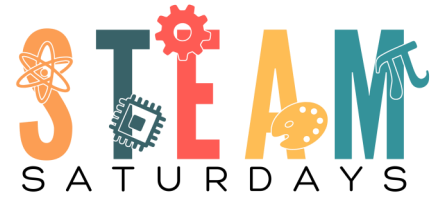

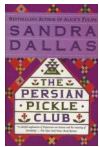
