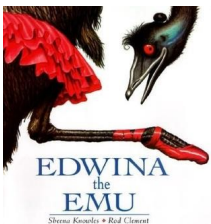

Edwina the Emu



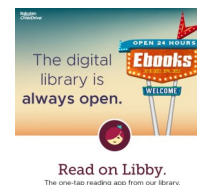

Ebooks and/or audiobooks from our library that used to be available through RBDigital are now available in Libby, Overdrive's reading app. Get started with Libby [here](#).

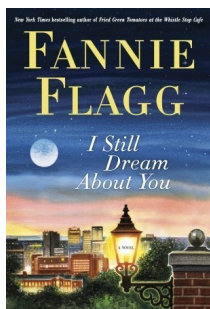
Magazines will still available through [RBDigital](#) until January 31, 2021, when they will also be found on Overdrive.
