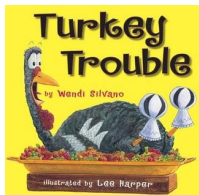

Turkey Trouble



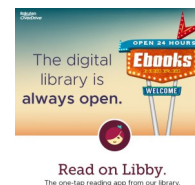

Magazines will still available through [RBDigital](#) until January 31, 2021, when they will also be found on Overdrive.

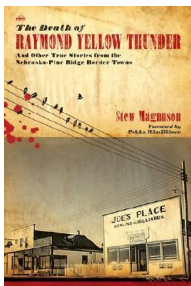


## Monthly Book Club Discussion

**Ultimate Thanksgiving Side Dish**  
6 servings - 303 calories per serving  
Ready in 50 minutes!

- 1 (15.5 ounce) can French-style green beans
  - 1 (15 ounce) can sliced potatoes, drained
  - 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of celery soup
  - 1 1/8 cups milk
  - 3 tablespoons French-fried onions, divided
  - salt & pepper to taste
  - garlic powder to taste
  - 1 (8 ounce) package dry bread stuffing mix
1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
  2. Place the green beans & potatoes into a 2 quart casserole dish. Stir in the cream of celery soup & milk. Season with salt, pepper, & garlic powder. Stir in 1 tablespoon of the French fried onions. Sprinkle the remaining onions on top.
  3. Bake for 30 minutes in the preheated oven. While the casserole is baking, prepare the stuffing according to package directions. Spread evenly over the top of casserole.
  4. Return to the oven for about 10 minutes, or until crunchy. You can broil for a few minutes for extra crunch. Enjoy!
