You can now check out seeds at the Fairbury Public Library to get your garden growing!

We have flowers, herbs, fruit, ornamental gourds and corn, and vegetables. Look for *Seed Library* in the catalog, or come to the children's side desk for a printed list to see what is available. You will be able to check out 10 seed packets per month, per family, but only two of each variety if enough are available. Must be a current library card holder to be able to use this service. On April 8th a Total Solar Eclipse will occur from southern Texas through the NE United States. Nebraska experienced the last total eclipse in 2017. This time, eastern Nebraska will experience about 75-80% sun coverage.
