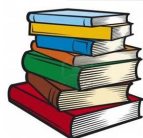

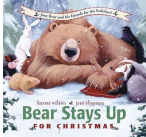


Welcome to StoryWalk® at Fairbury City Park!

Lots of activities to choose from:

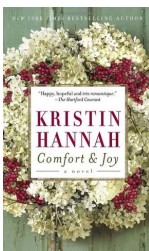
- Make and decorate a Christmas ornament using the AccuCut machine
