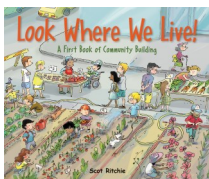

Now featured:

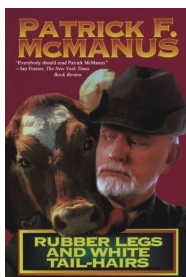
