Bureau Indian Affairs, in 2022, there were 562 federally recognized Indian tribes or nations in the United States. You can honor them by planting flowers and plants that are indigenous to your area, visit a museum, or check out Matika Wilber's incredible new book, Project 562, for which she spent years photographing and interviewing all 562 federally recognized Tribes, here at the library.

These narratives touch on personal and cultural identity as well as issues of media representation, sovereignty, faith, family, the protection of sacred sites, subsistence living, traditional knowledge-keeping, land stewardship, language preservation, advocacy, education, the arts and more.

For example, did you know our American founding fathers consulted with the Iroquois nation to write the U. S. Constitution, based on the Iroquois Constitution, or the Great Law of Peace?
