MONITORING AIR QUALITY
This kit provides resources and instructions to help you monitor the quality of the air in your neighborhood or outdoors. By using a combination of portable equipment and low-cost sensors, you can measure the level of harmful microscopic particles (particulate matter) in the air as well as humidity and temperature.

HOW THE KIT WORKS
Particulate matter (PM) is made up of microscopic particles in the air. When you breathe them, they can irritate your lungs and cause other health problems. To you know your personal exposure, when it comes to the air you breathe? By monitoring your PM exposure using the kit, you can make informed decisions about your health and the health of your community while providing data for environmental research and policy.
