This March, half a million Sandhill cranes will make their annual return to Nebraska's Central Platte River Valley for a layover during their migration to the arctic tundra breeding regions. During the day, cranes may be observed feeding in the fields near the river between Grand Island and Hastings. At night, they return to the river, calling with increasing urgency, trying to decide where they might land for the night.

Stop by the Fairbury Public Library and check out one of our books about the Sandhill Crane migration: *On Ancient Wings* by Michael Forsberg; *Those of the Gray Wind: the Sandhill Cranes* by Paul A. Johnsgard; *Sandhill and Whooping Cranes: Ancient Voices over America's Wetlands* by Paul A. Johnsgard; *Crane Tracking* by Eric Fowler, *Nebraskaland* magazine March 2026; *Luck* by Jean Craighead George; *Can You Dance like John?* by Jeff Kurrus; *Have You Seen Mary* by Jeff Kurrus.

To observe this natural wonder in person, the Crane Trust provides a Nature and Visitor Center, blinds and driving tours: CPNRD provides free viewing decks along the river; and Ft. Kearney State Recreation Area provides a paved hike-bike trail to a bridge over the Platte. Row Sanctuary near Minden also offers guided blind tours at sunrise and sunset, or you can watch their live Crane Cam online at rowe.audobon.org.

MONITORING AIR QUALITY
This kit provides resources and instructions to help you monitor the quality of the air you breathe indoors or outdoors. By using a combination of a portable instrument and free mobile app, you can measure the level of harmful microscopic particles (particulate matter) in the air as well as humidity and temperature.

WHY THIS MATTERS
Particulate matter (PM) is made up of microscopic particles in the air. When you inhale them, they could cause serious health problems in your lungs and throughout your bloodstream. Do you know your personal exposure risks when it comes to the air you breathe? By monitoring your PM exposure using the aQBeam instrument, app, and platform featured in this kit, you can make informed, healthier decisions about your daily route and routine while providing data for environmental research and public policy.

BirdTrack
BirdTrack is a free, online and smartphone-based recording tool for birdwatchers to store and manage their own records by recording when and where they watched birds then completing a list of the species seen and heard during the trip.

The data collected are used by researchers to investigate migration movements and distributions of birds and to support species conservation at local, national and international scales.
