FIREFLY ATLAS

GOAL: TO GATHER SPECIES-SPECIFIC DATA ON FIREFLIES IN THE USA AND CANADA.

The Firefly Atlas is a collaborative effort to better understand and conserve the diversity of fireflies in North America. Launched in 2022, the project aims to advance our collective understanding of firefly species' distributions, phenology, and habitat associations, as well as to identify threats to their populations.

OBSERVING POLLINATORS

Identify and count pollinators as they visit flowering plants.

WHY ARE POLLINATORS IMPORTANT?

Pollinators are critical to the world's agricultural food supply. In recent years, many pollinators have suffered severe declines, especially among honey bees.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

We can gather observations of pollinators visiting any flowering plant. Make as many observations as you want while they are blooming. It's that easy! Your participation can help scientists understand pollinator health and keep our wildlife communities vibrant.

Interesting facts about the month of June:

Named After a Goddess: The month is named after *Juno*, the ancient Roman goddess of marriage and childbirth. Because of this, it remains one of the most popular months for weddings.

The Longest Day: The summer solstice occurs in June, bringing the most hours of sunlight in a single day for the Northern Hemisphere.

Three Birthstones: June is one of only three months that boast three birthstones: the pearl, the moonstone, and the alexandrite.

The Strawberry Moon: The full moon that occurs in June is traditionally called the Strawberry Moon, a name given by Native American tribes
