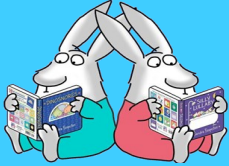

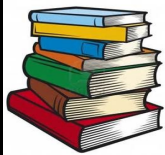

The Storywalk® combines physical activity with books to help build children's interest in reading while encouraging healthy activity for all! It begins on the southeast side of the Frontier Fun Park near the gravel parking lot. From there, follow the story by walking around the circle!

The tradition of wishing on a "Falling Star" or "Shooting Star" has been practiced for at least 2000 years, with records of "Shooting Star" wishing found in ancient Greek mythology. Falling Stars are actually meteors burning up in the earth's atmosphere. This month is a perfect opportunity to make those "Shooting Star" wishes as Meteor shower enthusiasts will be able to enjoy observing the Perseids Meteor Shower reaching their strongest maximum on August 12th or 13th. These dates coincide with a new moon; therefore the meteor shower viewing should be unobstructed by the light of the moon. As long as these nights are clear nights, meteors should be viewed at a rate of 50+ members per hour, plenty of chances to make those star wishes!

(Peak Shower time should be in the early morning hours before sunrise)

FIREFLY ATLAS

GOAL: TO GATHER SPECIES-SPECIFIC DATA ON FIREFLIES IN THE USA AND CANADA

The Firefly Atlas is a collaborative effort to better understand and conserve the diversity of fireflies in North America. Launched in 2022, the project aims to advance our collective understanding of firefly species' distributions, phenology, and habitat associations, as well as to identify threats to their populations.



ADD YOUR LOCAL OBSERVATIONS TO NASA SATELLITE DATA!

With this kit and the GLOBE Observer app, you can help spot and report potential mosquito breeding habitats (standing water or somewhere water could collect) and the presence of dangerous mosquito larvae. Optionally, you can sample and count the larvae and try to identify the mosquito type.

WHY THIS MATTERS

Mosquitoes are the world's most dangerous animal: millions of people die each year from mosquito-borne diseases. You can make a difference by helping with early warning of potential *Aedes* outbreaks.
